

# MOVIE SYNOPSIS



## THE HANGOVER – PART II (MA15+) – 102 Mins

Phil (Bradley Cooper), Alan (Zach Galifianakis) and Doug (Justin Bartha) jet to Thailand for Stu's (Ed Helms) wedding to Lauren (Jamie Chung) at an upmarket resort. But it seems like Groundhog Day, when Phil, Alan and Ed wake up in a sleazy hotel room in Bangkok with a cheeky monkey after a few beers on the beach with

Lauren's 16 year old brother Teddy (Mason Lee). Even worse is the fact that Teddy is now missing - except for a finger. And Mr Chow (Ken Jeong) manages to overdose on cocaine before he can help them.



## HOP (G) - 96 Mins

Fred (James Marsden) lazes around the house without a job, much to the chagrin of his father (Gary Cole) and mother (Elizabeth Perkins). When asked to house-sit a Beverly Hills mansion, he does so but literally runs into a talking rabbit named EB (voice of Russell Brand), who has left his home on Easter Island, dreaming of becoming a drummer. EB's father (voice of Hugh Laurie) is the Easter

Bunny, who runs a busy factory where chocolate eggs and bunnies are manufactured before being delivered to children around the world at Easter time.



## KUNG FU PANDA 2 (PG) – 90 Mins

Now living his dream as The Dragon Warrior, Po (voice of Jack Black) protects the Valley of Peace with fellow kung fu masters The Furious Five: Tigress (Angelina Jolie), Monkey (Jackie Chan), Mantis (Seth Rogen), Viper (Lucy Liu) and Crane (David Cross). Po's mentor, Master Shifu (Dustin Hoffman) tries to impress on

his student the importance of inner peace. But Po is a panda trying to sort out the puzzle of his childhood which his father Mr Ping (James Hong) - a goose - is trying to tell him. Meanwhile, there are other things to deal with, namely the emergence of a formidable peacock villain Lord Shen (Gary Oldman), who is intent on using a secret weapon to conquer China and destroy kung fu. Now it is up to Po to discover the secrets of his origins and save China.



## BRIDESMAIDS (MA15+) – 125 Mins

Annie (Kristen Wiig) and Lillian (Maya Rudolph) have been best friends all their lives, sharing everything since they were little girls. When Lillian becomes engaged, she naturally asks Annie to be her maid of honour. However, Annie's nose is quickly put out of joint when she meets Lillian's wealthy new friend Helen (Rose Byrne) who seems to want to steal Lillian's

friendship. Nothing in Annie's life is going right. Her occasional boyfriend Ted (Jon Hamm) is inconsiderate, her flatmates are making her life a misery and she is not sure how she feels about the local cop Officer Rhodes (Chris O'Dowd), who lets her car's broken tail-lights go without a fine. Will Annie ever find true happiness and will she and Lillian manage to remain best friends?



## CARS 2 (PG) – 113 Mins

Racing star Lightning McQueen (voice of Owen Wilson) is lured to race against his Italian rival Francesco Bernoulli (John Torturro) in the inaugural World Grand Prix organised by Sir Miles Axlerod (Eddie Izzard) to prove his new organic, renewable oil is better than normal petrol. McQueen takes along

best friend the towtruck, Mater (Larry The Cable Guy) but is not expecting to be drawn into a massive espionage caper with British agents Finn McMissile (Michael Caine) and Holly Shiftwell (Emily Mortimer). The race turns out to be the battle ground between good oil and bad oil, with a bunch of bad guys using secret weapons to make sure the baddies win. But they hadn't reckoned on the resourceful Mater...



## SUPER 8 (PG) – 110 Mins

In the summer of 1979, a group of young school friends in a small Ohio town led by aspiring director Charles (Riley Griffiths) and junior make-up trainee Joe (Joel Courtney) witness a catastrophic train crash while making a Super 8 zombie movie starring Alice (Elle Fanning) and soon suspect that there is more to the accident than meets the eye. Unusual disappearances and violent, inexplicable events begin to take place in

town, and as US military swarm the town, Joe's dad Jackson (Kyle Chandler), the local Deputy Sheriff, tries to uncover the truth - which turns out to be more terrifying than any of them could have imagined.



## .ORANGES AND SUNSHINE (M) – 105 Mins

In the late 1980s, Margaret Humphries (Emily Watson), an English social worker in Nottingham discovers a secret that the British government had kept hidden for four decades: 130,000 children in care had been sent abroad to commonwealth countries, mainly Australia. Children as young as four had been told that their parents were dead, and been sent to children's homes on

the other side of the world. Instead of being cared for in their new homes, many were subjected to appalling abuse. They were promised oranges and sunshine, they got hard labour and life pain. Margaret attempts to reunite as many families as she can.
